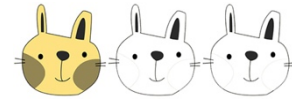

CUDDLY BUNNY

CROCHET PATTERN



Skill level: easy

Finished length about 8" (20 cm)

MATERIALS

Fingering (14 wpi; 4 ply; no 1: Super Fine) yarn such as Alize Bella , 1 ball that is about 50g or 200 yards

Crochet hook US 1.5 (2.5 mm) or to obtain **gauge 4" x 4" (10 x 10 cm) = 24 sts x 13 rows** (in half double crochet)

Tapestry needle, some filling material

Contrast color for decorating about 8g or 30 yards total

ABBREVIATIONS

St(s) – stitch(es)

Sl – slip

Ch – chain

Sc – single crochet

Dc – double crochet

Hdc – half double crochet

Sc2tog – single crochet 2 sts together

PATTERN NOTES

This pattern is written in US crochet terms

Before each sc round ch 1, end the round with sl to ch

Before each dc round ch 2, end the round with sl to top ch



THIS IS A FREE PATTERN

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HEAD

With your main yarn make a magic circle.

Round 1: Ch 1, 6 sc in ring, sl st to ch

Round 2: 2 sc in each sc around (12 sc)

Round 3: (2 sc in sc, 1 sc in next sc) around (18)

Round 4: (2 sc in sc, 1 sc in next 2 sc) around (24)

Round 5: (2 sc in sc, 1 sc in next 3 sc) around (30)

Round 6: (2 sc in sc, 1 sc in next 4 sc) around (36)

Round 7: (2 sc in sc, 1 sc in next 5 sc) around (42)

Round 8: (2 sc in sc, 1 sc in next 6 sc) around (48)

Rounds 9, 10, 11, 12: 1 sc in each sc around (48)

Round 13: (sc2tog, 1 sc in next 6 sc) around (42)

Round 14: (sc2tog, 1 sc in next 5 sc) around (36)

Round 15: (sc2tog, 1 sc in next 4 sc) around (30)

Round 16: (sc2tog, 1 sc in next 3 sc) around (24)

Round 17: (sc2tog, 1 sc in next 2 sc) around (18)

Round 18: (sc2tog, 1 sc in each next sc) around (12)

Cut the yarn leaving a long end, stuff the head and work the last round sc2tog 6 times.

Using your tapestry needle, weave in only on the outer loops of the remaining 6 single crochets.

EARS (MAKE 2)

Worked bottom up, after each row – turn!

Ch 5.

Row 1: 1 sc in the 2nd ch from the hook, 1 sc in next 3 ch (4)

Rows 2 and 3: 1 sc in each sc, turn (4)

Row 4: 1 sc in first sc, (2 sc in next sc) two times, 1 sc in last sc, turn (6)

Row 5: 1 sc in each sc, turn (6)

Row 6: 1 sc in next 2 sc, (2 sc in next sc) two times, 1 sc in last 2 sc, turn (8)

Rows 7, 8, 9, 10: 1 sc in each sc, turn

Row 11: 1 sc in next 2 sc, (sc2tog) two times, 1 sc in next 2 sc, turn (6)

Row 12: 1 sc in each sc, turn

Row 13: 1 sc in next sc, (sc2tog) two times, 1 sc in next sc, turn (4)

Row 14: 1 sc in each sc, turn

Row 15: (sc2tog) two times, turn (2)

Row 16: 1 sc in each sc, turn

Row 17: sc2tog, turn

Sc around the ear skipping the 4 stitches on foundation ch, skip straight to the other side of the ear (this will make the ears curve).

Attach the ears to the head.

With darker yarn embroider two dots for eyes and a triangle for nose.



BLANKET-BODY

Ch 4, sl st to first ch.

Round 1: Ch 2 (counts as 1st dc now and later), work 12 dc in ring, sl st to top ch

Round 2: (2 dc in each dc) all around (26 dc)

Round 3: (2 dc in dc, 1 dc in next dc) around (38)

Round 4: (2 dc in dc, 1 dc in next 2 dc) around (50 dc)

Keep increasing like Rounds 3-4 until you have 14 dc-s between the increases (you can add length by working more rounds at this point).

Change to lighter yarn and sc around (keep increasing, 15 dc between the increase stitches). End the round with sl st and cut the yarn.

Attach the head to the middle of the blanket. Weave in all ends!
